Designing Mythology is a questioning and proposal for old ways / new to exist as humans, using the process of 'mything' to reorientate back towards the planet, and recalibrate our value systems by dismantling the current shadow metaphors of the Western-colonial worldview. It proposes the restorying of scientific perspectives to offer a cosmology that includes humans as part of the living world whilst simultaneously removing us from the centre. Thus a recognition and return, via a circuitous route, to the worldviews, deep connection and sustainment of the first peoples of our planet.


ARTEFACTS

The following artefacts are representations of entities that form the Warawana Mythology. The mythology is an interpretation of the western-scientific understanding of the formation of the planet and the ongoing exchange of matter and energy that is an extension of that process. Weaver talks to this exchange, she is the entity that repatterns all matter, all the time. We can see this repatterning expressed through the relationship of birds and flowers; polinators / patterners. Waratah is the basket that holds all matter, a planetary vessel, I am, we are, held within the Waratah.

The artefacst were first published through the exhibition *A Matter of Myth*, at Sophie Gannon Gallery, Melbourne 2020. Everything that is, from plants to people to protozoa, has been formed from clouds of dust and gas. This started a long time ago, and everything that has been - and will be - formed is held within Waratah.

The process of forming and reforming is empowered by Weaver. Weaver is at one time vast, acting through gravity to pull dust into suns, and also minute, riding with the bird to pollinate the flower. Every pattern you know, every pattern that is is formed by Weaver.

I am, we are pattern formed by Weaver, held always by Waratah.












Weaver patterning (detail) reflected on surface of Ode to Waratah









Weaver ethereal antique mirror with acrylic fibre 66 x 44 cm, edition of 8








Weaver becoming matter antique mirror with fluted glass 88 x 57 cm, edition of 8








Weaver patterning antique mirror with printing 81 x 54 cm, edition of 8








Weaver earthly state / honeyeater gold leaf with paint on mirror 68 x 60 cm, edition of 8










Ode to Waratah hand-etched glass, polypropylene and steel 41.5 x 52.5 x 52.5cm, edition of 8








Ode to Waratah hand-etched glass, polypropylene and steel 50.5 x 52.5 x 52.5cm, edition of 8









